For illuminating a room, lighting ideally is a centerpiece that doesn't draw too much attention. While these points appear to contradict each other, the Pelikansgrand embodies a bit of each. A thin, matte steel body, undulating yet angular, appears almost like a flowering vine with semi-transparent glass shades at the ends. Yet, its size occupies less space than your average floor lamp, and as such, its warm, somewhat quirky presence never comes off as sharp and forced.

Arrange a pair as end tables, or in taking advantage of its sturdier construction, use it as a base for a larger figurine, lamp, or indoor plant.

Even small things turn into a grand gesture. This accent table's scrolling, while short at a glance, has Grecian column-worthy details, adding an air of stateliness to your living space. Yet, it's not all pomp and formalities. Instead, paint rubbed away to produce an aged, rustic character infuses it with particular blast-from-the-past charm.



Should a table reflect the space, or the space reflect the table? This piece manages to do both. Wooden framework with an antique finish blends into rustic-leaning rooms, while metallic-painted glass tiles simultaneously act as a mirror displaying the surroundings.
